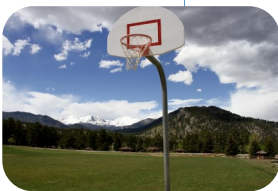
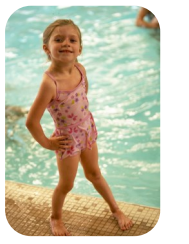

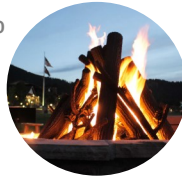

A = Most Difficult B = Very Demanding C = Demanding D = Strenuous E = Moderate Plus F = Moderate G = Easy H = Easiest

**Prerequisites:** To meet the prerequisite for an A, B, C, and D hike, a hiker must have completed without difficulty a YMCA of the Rockies (hikemaster-led) hike of no more than two grades lower within two weeks before the hike. This means a C hike is the prerequisite for an A hike (some A hikes may require additional hiker scrutiny due to their high level of physical demand); a
